I move a little. Then I hear a soft crack². A small light comes in where I live.






"Really? I am happy to meet you, big brother Dotty" the little chick answers kindly.




"Brilliant! I have a brother!"






A ray of hope⁴⁸ gives us new strength.


I catch him just in time! Panting⁶², we hold on to each other.

At that moment, a dolphin jumps out of the waves.


It sings a special song and dives happily into the water. It seems as if it is celebrating⁷⁰ with us too.


